



Modern slavery statement for financial year ended 31 Dec'25

This statement is made pursuant to s.54 of the Modern Slavery Act 2015 and sets out the steps that Quattro (UK) Ltd has taken and is continuing to take to ensure that modern slavery or human trafficking is not taking place within our business or supply chain. Quattro (UK) Ltd

Modern slavery encompasses slavery, servitude, human trafficking and forced labour. Quattro (UK) Ltd has a zero tolerance approach to any form of modern slavery. We are committed to acting ethically and with integrity and transparency in all business dealings and to putting effective systems and controls in place to safeguard against any form of modern slavery taking place within the business or our supply chain.

Our business

Quattro (UK) Ltd is a regional supplier of aggregates, waste management, ready mixed concrete, and haulage services to the construction and utilities industries. We operate across multiple sites within the UK and employ a mixed skilled workforce. We primarily use UK and European based suppliers and operate an approved supplier system.

Our high risk areas

We have a large number of foreign nationals in our employment, all new staff are subject to the same document checks regardless of their nationality. These checks are carried out by an independent checking service.

Our policies

We operate a number of internal policies to ensure that we are conducting business in an ethical and transparent manner. These include:

1. Anti-slavery policy. This policy sets out the organisation's stance on modern slavery and explains how employees can identify any instances of this and where they can go for help.
2. Recruitment policy. We operate a robust recruitment policy, including conducting eligibility to work in the UK checks for all employees to safeguard against human trafficking or individuals being forced to work against their will.

Our suppliers

Quattro (UK) Ltd operates a supplier policy and maintains a preferred supplier list. We conduct due diligence on all suppliers before allowing them to become a preferred supplier. This due diligence includes an online search to ensure that particular organisation has never been convicted of offenses relating to modern slavery

Our anti-slavery policy forms part of our contract with all suppliers and they are required to confirm that no part of their business operations contradicts this policy.

In addition to the above, as part of our contract with suppliers, we require that they confirm to us that:

1. They have taken steps to eradicate modern slavery within their business
2. They hold their own suppliers to account over modern slavery
3. (For UK based suppliers) They pay their employees at least the national minimum wage / national living wage (as appropriate)
4. (For international suppliers) They pay their employees any prevailing minimum wage applicable within their country of operations.
5. We may terminate the contract at any time should any instances of modern slavery come to light.





Training

We provide information to our Managers and Supervisors so that they understand the signs of modern slavery and what to do if they suspect that it is taking within our supply chain.

Our performance indicators

We will know the effectiveness of the steps that we are taking to ensure that slavery and/or human trafficking is not taking place within our business or supply chain if:

- No reports are received from employees, the public, or law enforcement agencies to indicate that modern slavery practices have been identified.
